Improvised Explosive Device (IED) Construction and Classification (AWR-333) provides an overview of the various components of an IED. Learners are presented the foundational knowledge about the construction and classification of IEDs that include their function, components, classifications, and how they are constructed.

- Recognize IED components through the use of the SIMPC-E acronym
- Distinguish between IED categorizations and delivery methods
