TRAINING COURSE OVERVIEW

Response to Suspicious Behaviors and Items for Bombing Prevention (AWR-335) provides participants with a foundational introduction to recognizing and responding to suspicious behaviors and activities related to terrorist or criminal actions. This course also highlights what to do when encountering an unattended or suspicious item and to whom to report it.

COURSE INFORMATION

This one-hour instructor-led training covers the following topics:

- Normal behavior and suspicious behavior indicators
- Unattended and suspicious items
- Appropriate responses to suspicious behaviors, unattended items, and suspicious items

This course is designed for groups of up to 50 participants and is intended for audiences such as:

- Critical infrastructure owners and operators
- Public safety officers
- Emergency managers
- Private sector security professionals
- Law enforcement officers
- Security officers
