

## Bomb-Making Materials Awareness Employee Training (AWR-921)

The **Bomb-Making Materials Awareness Employee Training** course teaches participants how to recognize suspicious purchasing behaviors in a retail setting that might indicate Bomb-Making activity and what to do when a suspicious incident occurs.

## **Course Format and Audience**

This 35-minute independent study training (IST) is a self-paced, web-based course covering the following topics:

- The types of people who build bombs
- Commercially available products used to make homemade explosives and build improvised explosive devices
- Suspicious purchases and behaviors
- How to report a suspicious incident

This course is designed for retail personnel and community members interested in preventing bombing incidents. Participants may work in a variety of settings, including:

- Beauty supply stores
- Home-improvement stores
- Online retailers
- Pool supply retailers
- Other retailers

### Accreditation
