In this third Commemorative Series, we call to mind the significant efforts of the ISC members to prepare federal facilities to meet the threats they face.

It was in February 7 years ago, that the ISC published *Items Prohibited from Federal Facilities: An Interagency Security Committee Standard*. This Standard establishes a process for detailing control of prohibited items into federal facilities and identifies responsibilities for denying entry to those individuals who attempt to enter with such items. These items were determined to create risk to both the occupant agencies and the visiting public. This baseline list is both customizable and scalable.
