


THE RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESS: AN INTERAGENCY SECURITY COMMITTEE STANDARD



THE INTERAGENCY SECURITY COMMITTEE (ISC) was formed by Executive Order (EO) 12977 following the bombing of the Alfred P. Murah Federal Building in Oklahoma City, OK. Today, the ISC is chaired by the Department of Homeland Security and consists of a permanent body with representatives from 64 federal departments and agencies to address continuing government-wide physical security needs for federal facilities. Consistent with EO 12977, ISC publications, standards, and recommendations apply to all nonmilitary Executive Branch departments and agencies within the borders of the United States and its territories.
