NIAC Studies

 NIAC delivered 26 studies and reports from 2004-2015

Recommendations totaled 265



Subjects

- Topics encompassed the entire range of critical infrastructure issues:
 - Cyber, physical and work force security strategies
 - Public-private partnership models and approaches
 - CI Intelligence and information sharing
 - Entire range of national preparedness of CI from prevention, protection, consequence mitigation, response to recovery and resilience
 - CI risk management and effective practices



Definitions of Recommendation Implementation

Status [1]	Definition
Fully Implemented	 Accepted for full implementation
Partially Implemented	Accepted for partial implementation
Not implemented	 Recommendation will not be implemented by assigned agency
Under Review	 Assigned agencies determining feasibility for implementation

Note [1]: Recommendations may take years to implement, so status reflects agency's acceptance or non-acceptance of a recommendation for implementation.



Results Summary 2004-2015

Status	Number of Recommendations	% of Total Recommendations
Fully Implemented	194	73.2%
Partially Implemented	16	6.0%
Not Implemented	16	6.0%
Under Review	39	14.7%
Total	265	100%



NIAC Study Observations

NIAC advice far-sighted

- Identified issues and risks, and proposed approaches to address them years before they were recognized as priorities
- E.g. Insider threat, convergence of physical and cyber Issues and their challenges, cross sector dependencies

NIAC advice impactful

- Relatively high acceptance for implementation (nearly 80%)
- Extensively researched
- Data collected from wide range of sources and perspectives
- Deemed useful and influential by various sources in academia, SLTTG, and parts of CI community because of its participant inclusiveness in study development



Effective Recommendations

- Evolution over time on clarity and focus
 - Specificity of actions to take
 - Specificity of accountability in recommendations (the NIAC advises agency heads and the President)
 - Understanding and incorporating required precursors as recommendations to achieve a specific identified outcome (e.g. legislation, policy, authorities, organizational structure)
 - Recognition of potential time required, and identifying milestones to measure progress
